For more than 20 years Amedeo Postiglione has been an untiring and enthusiastic mentor behind a global movement for the attainment of a human right to the environment and for the protection of sustainability of life on earth.

He pioneered the use of legal information technology applied to the environment and promoted the establishment of the Ministry of the Environment in Italy.

In 1988 he initiated a global campaign for the creation of an International Court of the Environment which would provide access not only to the States but to associations and individuals and would be based on a supranational legal charter.

His considerable success has been confirmed by a series of international conferences on the environment held in famous Italian historical cities: Rome, Florence, and Venice both before and after the Earth Summit of Rio de Janeiro and by the very important fact that, through a Decree of 24 September 1991, the Italian Supreme Court made him Director of the Scientific Secretariat for the promotion of the International Court of the Environment.

His special interests include electronic processing of legal information, legal aspects of environmental protection, protected areas and environmental education.

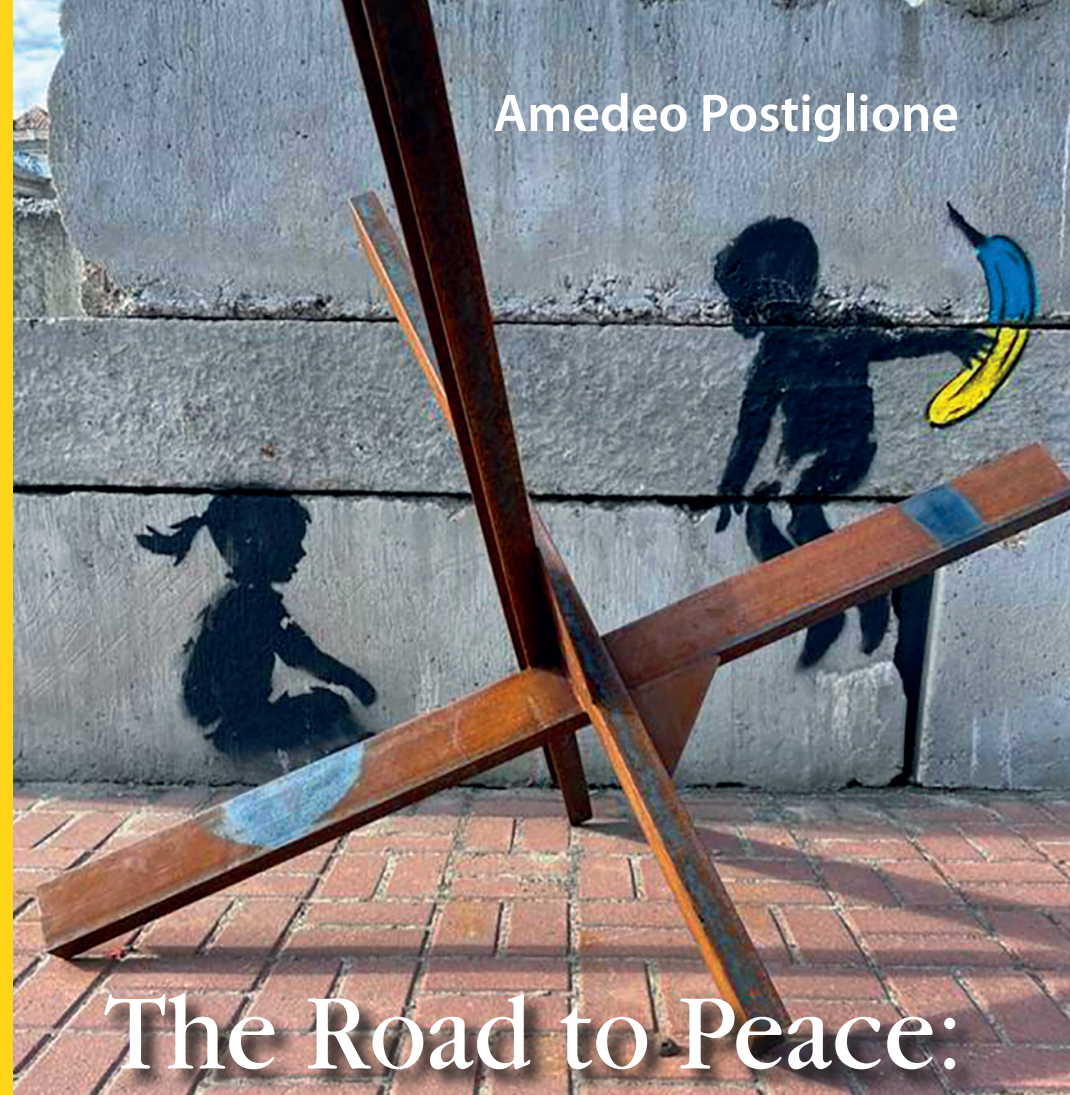
The book is very timely and interesting because it is the result of a collective work by the ICEF Foundation, aimed at strengthening (mandatory and accessible) international justice.

It includes important contributions (also in English) on climate justice, the war in Ukraine, a commentary on the 2015 Paris Agreement on climate change, a commentary on the Papal Encyclical "Pacem in Terris" 60 years after its issue, the Draft of a Universal Declaration of Individual's and People's Duties (in Italian, English and French), a detailed proposal for Global Governance for Peace, the Environment and the Economy with the relative strengthening of international law and of the United Nations' model in a universal and democratic sense. The importance of the provision of a human right and duty towards the international order and respect for the principles of the United Nations set out in Articles 28, 29 and 30 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights of 1948 are emphasized in the method.
